

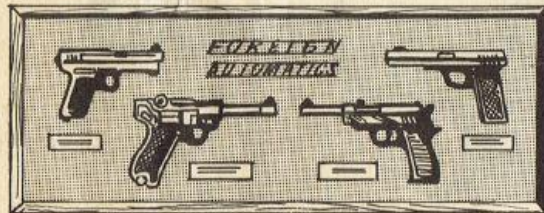

Cover a $\frac{1}{4}$ " plywood board with cloth, such as natural linen, bur-lap or colored felt. Mount & label Guns. Frame with inexpensive $\frac{1}{2}$ " moulding as illustrated or moulding of your choice.

HOW TO DISPLAY YOUR SINGLE GUNS



Mount a picture of your choice on a $\frac{1}{4}$ " plywood board before mounting your gun and label. Frame with $\frac{1}{2}$ " moulding or any frame you like. Pictures will create atmosphere. For example; a German Soldier behind your Luger; a Western Gunman behind your Frontier Colt; a gambler or dance hall girl behind the Derringer, etc.

MAUSER 7.65 MM AUTOMATIC



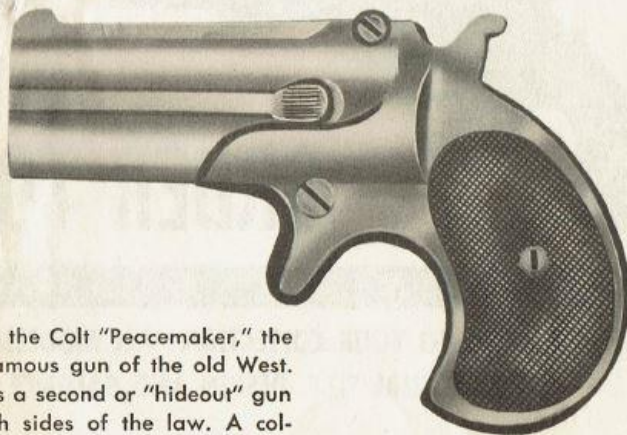
The favorite pocket hide-out pistol of European officers. A very rare collectors item! **3.95**

GERMAN 9 MM LUGER

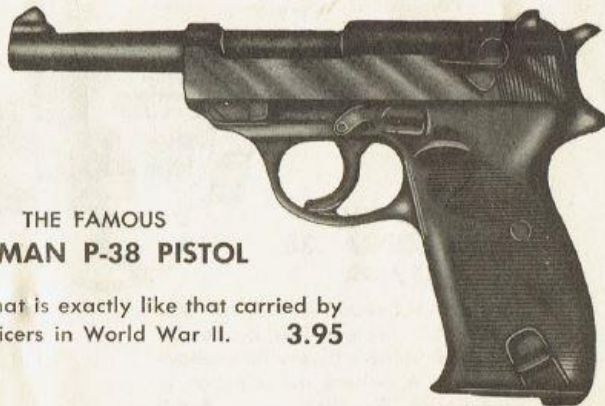


One of the most versatile weapons ever made. Carried by officers as a side arm. Semi-automatic. Could be fitted to a special stock and used as a rifle. **3.95**

Another fascinating souvenir for your World War II collection. This accurate weapon was used by the courageous French in their fight for freedom. **3.95**



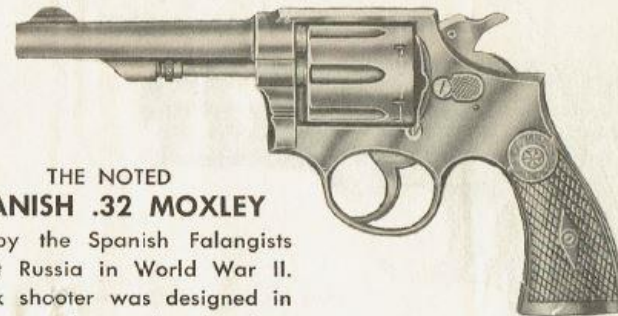
THE FAMOUS

Here is a gun that is exactly like that carried by the German officers in World War II. **3.95**



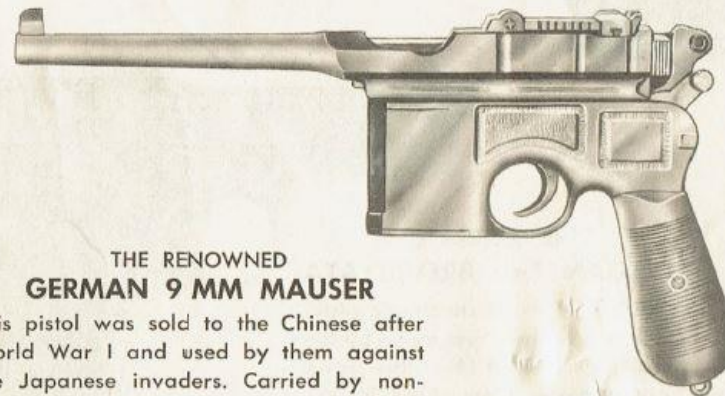
THE INFAMOUS

Standard Japanese officer's side arm. Used in the island invasions against our country. Luger type of design with 10 shell clip. **3.95**



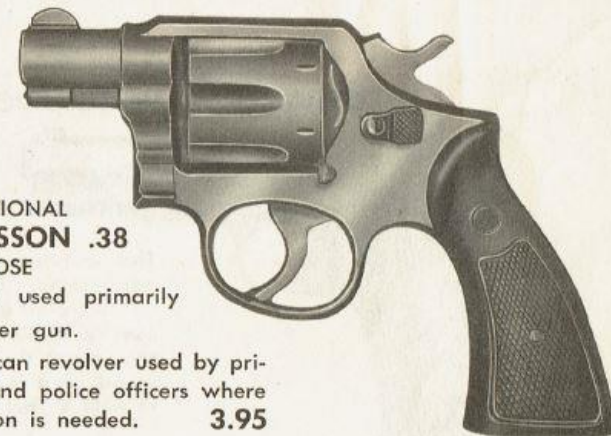
THE NOTED

This pistol was sold to the Chinese after World War I and used by them against the Japanese invaders. Carried by non-commissioned officers. **4.50**

A police special used primarily as an undercover gun.

A six shot American revolver used by private detectives and police officers where fast positive action is needed. **3.95**

CZECHOSLOVAKIAN PISTOL



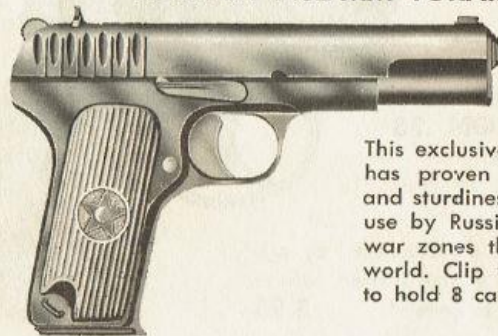
Styled after the German Walther. Used chiefly by the underground in close range attacks upon the hated German Gestapo. **3.95**

This small semi - automatic pistol was one of the finest made by the Fascists. Carried by the crack Alpine troops. Later used by the underground. **3.95**



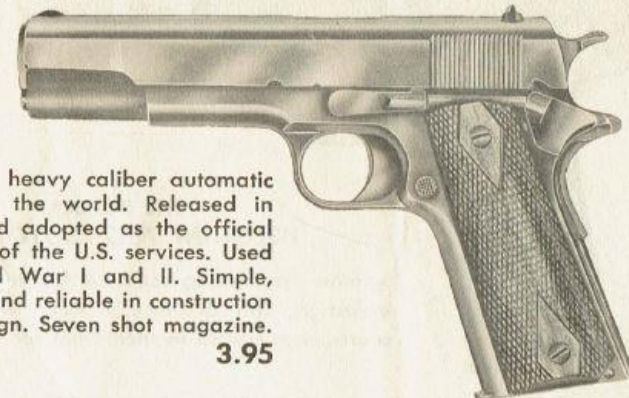
THE REMARKABLE

COLT .45 AUTOMATIC



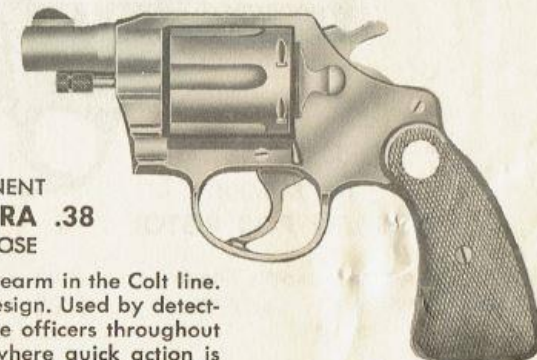

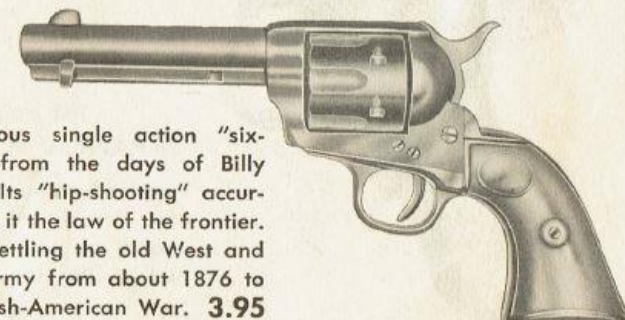
THE EMINENT
